This paper examines a novel adaptation of Aristophanes' *Lysistrata*, Francisco Arriví's *Club de Solteros*. Unlike many modern adaptations in which Lysistrata espouses a variety of political causes, Arriví distorts the well-established Aristophanic paradigm to explore an absurd concept that is divorced from a larger political framework — in this case a club of bachelors and ascetic men which is suitably led by Dr. Hipólito (Dr. Hippolytus). The paper discusses Club de Solteros as one of the earliest depictions of Men's Rights Activists and analyzes the unique perspective that the play offers on twentieth century Puerto Rican social issues and gender relations.
