This essay argues that the second century BCE noblewoman Cornelia merits inclusion in E. Malcovati's fragments of the Roman orators along with actual Latin words of a letter attributed to her by the first century BCE biographer and historian Cornelius Nepos. These words resemble those cited by Malcovati in the entry for Cornelia's father Publius Cornelius Scipio Africanus maior, cos. 205 and 194 BCE as well as those she cites in her entry for Cornelia's addressee, her younger son Gaius Tiberius Gracchus.
