This chapter re-evaluates the relationships among elite women and the triumph in the Republic and early Empire (509 BCE–47 CE). It uncovers how female relatives of triumphal generals were associated with and integrated into the triumph via the triumphal chariot, ancestor masks, funerals, names, and banquets. Through these associations elite women were invested and involved in the triumph, accruing status for themselves and their families. The triumph itself was fundamentally a family affair.
