This edited volume theorizes an engagement with Greco-Roman antiquity beyond the terms of humanism, construed as a tradition which has leveraged a classicized antiquity to affirm the superiority of idealized bodies and subjects at the expense of others and humans over non-humans. Many of the essays explore the “human” as a gendered category while finding resources in ancient Greek and Roman text to forge new understandings of life, including new understandings of gender and embodiment.
