

Carney, E. D. (2000) *Women and Monarchy in Ancient Macedonia*. Norman, Oklahoma, University of Oklahoma Press.

This monograph is the first to examine the role of women in Macedonian monarchy from its beginnings to its end with Roman conquest. It is a study of the political role of women in Macedonia throughout its independent history, over several dynasties. In addition to the main narrative, it also contains biographical studies of all named royal women. These studies, though printed in a different font from that of the main text. There is an alphabetical index to these biographical essays at the end of the book.
